Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Benton, 97, Atkinson's Buildings, Howden Clough Road, have received news that their son, Private James Benton (27), Yorks. and Lancs., died of peritonitis in a Syrian casualty clearing station on September 10th.

Before joining the Army six years ago he was employed in the finishing department of Messrs. Wm. Baines, Britannia Mills, Morley. He had seen service in India, Palestine and Crete. Before joining the Army in 1935 James was employed in the finishing department of Messrs. William Baines, Britannia Mills, Morley. He saw service in India, Palestine and Crete. He died of peritonitis in a Syrian casualty clearing station in Syria on 10 September 1941.

James was awarded the 1939-45 Star; 1939-1945 War Medal

He is remembered with Honour at Batley War Memorial.
