Ralph was born on 6 January 1913 the son of George and Elizabeth Newton Wilson (nee Roberts) who had married at St. Johns Church, Cleckheaton on 4 June 1898. Ethel was born in 1900, Harold 1903, Laura 1906, Eunice Newton 1910, Ralph, and Alice 1919. In 1939 the family was living at 5, Britannia Terrace, Spenborough and Ralph gave his occupation as a postal clerk. His mother died in 1943.

Ralph was a native of Cleckheaton and attended Moorend National School. He started at Cleckheaton Post Office as a messenger and when he was called up in 1940 was a postman. At one time he was a member of St. Johns Church Choir and was also a member of the Hartshead Cricket Club and a keen dancer.

Ralph married Clara Main of 10, Upton Street, Batley on 28 June 1941.

Ralph died in the Chanctonbury District of Sussex whilst serving in this country.

The funeral took place at Cleckheaton New Cemetery following a service, conducted by Rev. R.J.M. May at St. Johns Church.
